Tennessee General Assembly Funds Summer EBT for 2027

Nashville, TN, April 17, 2026 – Summer EBT will return to Tennessee families in 2027, bringing back a program that provided a modest amount of money to support 700,000 children and their families to buy groceries during the summer when hunger spikes. After over a year of public outcry from parents, faith leaders, county mayors, and non-profit organizations, Tennessee has recognized the importance of acting on child hunger. Tennessee participated in Summer EBT in 2024, then opted out in 2025, leaving the families of 700,000 children without support to help pay the grocery bills at a time when food prices are at an all-time high.

This would not have been possible without the tireless efforts of Representative Michael Hale and Senator Paul Bailey who secured the funding. Their sponsoring of the Summer EBT bill HB1835/SB1911 in Tennessee's 114th General Assembly provided the impetus for the legislature to fund Summer EBT in 2027.

Although bringing Summer EBT back in 2027 is a step in the right direction, Tennessee families still face this upcoming summer without Summer EBT, and there is no guarantee that Summer EBT will be funded in 2028. "This is a win for Tennessee children and their families in 2027, and legislators have acknowledged that hunger is a problem. But hunger will continue into 2028 and a long-term commitment to feed and support children in Tennessee is imperative."
