



(1) From reporting, pursuant to Public Chapter 1106, of the 114<sup>th</sup> General Assembly, to the centralized immigration enforcement division within the Tennessee Department of Safety identifying information about patients receiving health care services through Tennessee's Children's Special Services ("C.S.S.") program whom the Tennessee Department of Health has determined are not "lawfully present" in the United States under the federal Immigration and Nationality Act.

(2) To disregard any requests for disenrollment from the C.S.S. program made by, or on behalf of, any children who were enrolled in the C.S.S. program as of June 1, 2026, whose lawful presence the Department could not confirm, and to restore the program status of all such C.S.S. participants to that which they held as of June 1, 2026. No C.S.S. participant to whom the Department sent the June 1, 2026 letter shall be disenrolled or otherwise removed from the program because of the Department's determination that a C.S.S. participant is not lawfully present.

(3) To annually recertify, pursuant to the criteria set forth in Tenn. Comp. R. and Regs. 1200-11-03-.03, each C.S.S. participant who was sent the Department's June 1, 2026 letter, without consideration of whether the C.S.S. participant is lawfully present.

(4) To notify patients and providers to whom the Department sent a letter dated June 1, 2026, regarding Public Chapter 1106, of the existence of this temporary injunction, and that it will remain in effect pending further orders of the Court. The notice shall be provided in the primary language on record for the patient and shall be sent by the Defendants to Plaintiffs' counsel for an opportunity to comment before issuance.

(5) To notify patients and providers to whom the Department sent a letter dated June 1, 2026, regarding Public Chapter 1106, that any updated information with regard to this temporary

injunction will be posted on the Department's C.S.S. webpage. A copy of this temporary injunction, or a link thereto, will be provided on the Department's C.S.S. webpage.

It is further ORDERED that the parties waive any deficiency to the issuance of this Temporary Injunction Agreed Order based on a lack of findings of fact or conclusions of law, <sup>PHM</sup> ~~or~~ restraining previously posted shall remain in place, pursuant to Tenn. R. Civ. P. 65.05. PHM  
~~The non-issuance of an~~injunction bond/by Plaintiffs/ These proceedings including discovery are stayed pending the outcome of the Petition for Declaratory Order filed by Plaintiffs with the Tennessee Department of Health on June 22, 2026.

It is further ORDERED that by entering into this Agreed Temporary Injunction, Defendants do not concede any liability, wrongdoing, or make any admission as part of this case or waive any claims or defenses they may have and Plaintiffs do not concede any argument or waive any claims that they may have.

It is so **ORDERED**.
