

SUMMER P-EBT



WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

- Students enrolled in the free or reduced-priced school meal program at the end of the 2020-2021 school year or
- Students who apply for free or reduced priced meals before July 31.
- Students attending a Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) school during the 2020-2021 school year.
- Children ages 5 and under who are part of a SNAP household and who received early childcare P-EBT.

Students do not need to have missed school because of COVID-19 during the school year to be eligible for Summer P-EBT.

Parents who do not participate in SNAP can apply by July 31, 2021, to be eligible for Summer P-EBT for children under 6.

HOW WILL I GET MY BENEFITS?

Summer P-EBT benefits will be added to the P-EBT card that many families received this spring.

If your child never received a P-EBT card, but is eligible for Summer P-EBT, a new card will be sent to your home address.

Parents with children ages 5 and under who participate in SNAP will see the Summer P-EBT added to their SNAP card.

CAN I CHECK IF MY CHILD WILL GET P-EBT?

THERE IS NO APPLICATION FOR SUMMER P-EBT

The Pandemic Electronic Benefit Transfer (P-EBT) program was created for children who missed school meals during the pandemic. The program gives families with eligible children money to buy food. Summer P-EBT will provide \$375 per eligible child for the entire summer.
